



Did you know?

You may be eligible to receive **in-state tuition** if you attended high school in Kansas for three or more years, even if you don't have a lawful immigration status.

Under Kansas law, you are eligible to receive in-state tuition at

PUBLIC KANSAS UNIVERSITIES,
COMMUNITY COLLEGES,
AND TECHNICAL COLLEGES,
regardless of your immigration status,

if you meet these criteria:

- 1. You attended high school in Kansas for three or more years,
- 2. You graduated from high school in Kansas (or earned a GED in Kansas), and
- 3. If you don't have a lawful immigration status, or if you have a legal nonpermanent immigration status, 1 you must send an affidavit to the college saying you will apply to legalize your immigration status as soon as you can. To get a copy of that affidavit to sign, contact the college's admissions or registrar's office.

For more information, contact your high school counselor or the registrar's office at your college.
