

We are often told that it's our civic duty to vote, but the instructions on voting can sometimes be unclear. Here's a step-by-step guide on how to vote.

Registering to Vote:

- Online: You can register to vote online through the Kansas Secretary of State's website. Visit the voter registration page and follow the instructions to complete your registration.
- By Mail or In Person: You can also register to vote by filling out a paper voter registration form, mailing it to your county election office, or delivering it in person.

Deadlines for Registering:

 The deadline to register to vote in Kansas is 21 days before Election Day. Register before this deadline to ensure your eligibility to vote in the upcoming elections.

Finding Your Polling Place:

 Your residential address determines your polling place. You can locate your polling place by going here: https://www.ksvotes.org/

- Before Election Day, take time to review your ballot. The Kansas Secretary of State's
 website typically provides a sample ballot specific to your district. Familiarize yourself with
 the candidates running for office and any ballot measures or initiatives that will be on the
 ballot.
- Your local newspaper will often have information on candidates' positions and background, as well as information on any initiatives or other ballot measures.

Important Dates for the 2024 Election:

- October 15: Deadline to register to vote in the general election
- October 16: First day of early in-person voting
- October 29: Last day to apply for advance ballot for the general election
- November 5: Election Day
